Friday, November 2: How to Murder Your Wife (1965) Not Rated

After impetuously wedding a beauty he just met, a cartoonist fantasizes about getting out of the hasty marriage by plotting his wife's murder in his cartoon strip. But then she vanishes and the police show up on his doorstep. A classic dark comedy. Starring Jack Lemmon, Virna Lisi and Claire Trevor.

Saturday, November 3: Madame Bovary (2015) R—some sexuality and nudity

In this faithful adaptation of Flaubert's immortal novel, young Emma Bovary's passions overwhelm her solemn vows of marriage when a dashing Marquis captivates her heart, ultimately leading her down the path to ruin. Starring Mia Wasikowska and Paul Giamatti.

Sunday, November 4: Won't You Be My Neighbor? (2018) PG-13

Touching on the many facets and talents of a unique and beloved personality, this affectionate documentary profiles ingenuous and kindly Fred Rogers, host of the children's show "Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood" for more than 30 years.

Friday, November 9: Paddington 2 (2018) PG

Paddington is happily settled with the Brown family and searching for the perfect present for his beloved Aunt Lucy's 100th birthday. Hilarity and adventure ensue in this movie with its heart in the right place. Starring Sally Hawkins, Hugh Bonneville, and Hugh Grant.

Saturday, November 10: The Painted Veil (2006) PG-13

Set in 1920s China and based on a novel by W. Somerset Maugham. A young English couple (a doctor and a society girl) marry hastily. They relocate to Shanghai where she betrays him and he takes her with him to the countryside during a cholera outbreak. Starring Naomi Watts, Edward Norton and Liev Schreiber.

Sunday, Nov. 11 (Armistice Day): Frantz (2017) PG-13 (French & German with subtitles)

In a small town in Germany in the wake of World War I, young Anna tends her fallen fiance's grave each day. During one of her visits, she sees a stranger placing a bouquet on the grave and soon comes to learn that the two men were once friends. But all is not what it seems.

Friday, November 16: The Frisco Kid (1979) PG

Armed with his yarmulke and a cross-country mission to reach San Francisco's Barbary Coast during the Gold Rush, a naive Polish rabbi is a natural target for swindlers and thieves. But with a rough-and-tumble bank robber by his side, he takes on the American West. Directed by Robert Aldrich and starring Gene Wilder and Harrison Ford.

Saturday, November 17: Tulip Fever (2017) R—sex scenes

As 17th-century Amsterdam is immersed in tulip mania, a struggling artist and a wealthy married woman fall in love when he's commissioned to paint her portrait. Starring Alicia Vikander, Christoph Waltz and Judi Dench.

Sunday, November 18: The Sense of an Ending (2017) PG-13

A retired, divorced, somewhat lonely man receives an unexpected legacy touching off reminders of his student days. He probes his memories and gradually learns they are filled with errors. Based on the Booker-winning novel by Julian Barnes and starring Jim Broadbent, Charlotte Rampling, Michelle Dockery and Emily Mortimer.

Friday, November 23: Miracle on 34th Street (1947) Not Rated

When Santa falls down drunk in the Thanksgiving Day Parade, a reluctant Macy's supervisor offers the job to a bearded Kris Kringle purporting to be the real Santa. Starring Maureen O'Hara, Edmund Gwenn, Gene Lockhart and Natalie Wood.

Saturday, November 24: Friday Night Lights (2004) PG-13

A gritty but heartwarming tale that chronicles the efforts of the coach of a local football team in small-town Odessa, Texas to propel his squad to the state championships. But the path to glory is paved with racial and economic strife. Starring Billy Bob Thornton.

Sunday, November 25: RBG (2018) PG

This documentary provides an illuminating look at the life of trailblazer Ruth Bader Ginsburg—including her career-defining work in gender-discrimination law—and charts her journey to becoming a justice on the Supreme Court.

Friday, November 30: The Apartment (1960) Not Rated

Trying to further his career, an insurance clerk lends his apartment to his adulterous higher-ups for their amorous affairs. Starring Jack Lemmon, Shirley MacLaine and Fred MacMurray.

Saturday, December 1: Passengers (2016) PG-13

During the 120-year journey of the "Starship Avalon" to a distant planetary colony, a computer glitch rouses one man from hibernation decades ahead of schedule. Desperate for company, he wakes up a female passenger. Starring Jennifer Lawrence, Chris Pratt and Michael Sheen.

Sun., Dec. 2: The Widow of St. Pierre (2001) R-language & sexual scene, French, subtitles

In 1849 on the French fishing island of St. Pierre a man awaits execution for murder under the watchful eye of the captain of the island guard who is waiting for a guillotine to arrive from the mainland. Starring Juliette Binoche and Daniel Auteuil.
